FALL CLASSES BEGIN TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 3

CTA OPEN HOUSE - SATURDAY, AUGUST 24 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM

Students will initially be placed at a level based on age and academic grade. Each teacher will evaluate students on ability and experience, and determine an appropriate class level if an adjustment is necessary. Classes must meet an enrollment minimum of four in order to hold the class unless otherwise noted.

Center for Theatre Arts strives to make sure all feel welcome regardless of age, race, sex, economic status, religion, gender identity, or sexual orientation. Our program offers need-based scholarships, the use of preferred pronouns, and accommodation of student's individual needs to the best of our abilities.

CTA classes still meet during USD 305 inservice days. Our scheduled breaks are determined by USD305. CTA follows the USD305 schedule for weather and holiday closures. These cancellations will be communicated via email by the Education Director and/or teachers. Individual class cancellations will be announced by the teachers and a makeup class will be scheduled if possible.

Registration opens on Monday, July 15. Ideally, registration is complete on or before Tuesday, September 3. Open enrollment will continue, but closes November 4 to ensure productive class work can begin to be made towards CenterStage.

DRESS CODE

Each class has a specific dress code depending on the skill being taught. Street clothes and shoes must be worn over dance clothes when entering and exiting the building for safety and health of students. Hair should be out of the face for all students in classes. Please note that Center for Theatre Arts accepts gender-neutral dress in our classes. If the dancer chooses, they may wear close-fitting, solid color attire not on this specified list.

BALLET: Female-identifying students must wear skin-toned tights, a black leotard, and have hair pulled back in a bun and securely off the face. Ballet shoes that match tights tone are required (canvas preferred). A single layer black chiffon skirt may be worn. Snug ballet sweaters for warmth are acceptable. Male-identifying students must wear a black/white leotard or fitted shirt with black tights/leggings and black canvas ballet shoes.

POINTE: Pointe shoes are only worn with permission from the instructor. Ballet dress code applies. Pointe shoes should match skin tone.

JAZZ: All students enrolled in Jazz are required to have flat jazz shoes (color determined by instructor). Slip on styles are preferred. All students should wear form fitting activewear that shows the shape of the body movements with full coverage of legs.

TAP: All students enrolled in a tap class need flat black tap shoes. Appropriate attire is described under Jazz.

CONTEMPORARY: Students should expect to dance in bare feet/socks unless otherwise prompted. Appropriate attire is described under Jazz.

HIP HOP: Students should wear 'indoor only' sneakers to dance.

Appropriate attire is described under jazz.

ACRO CONDITIONING: Female-identifying students should wear a leotard; male-identifying students should wear a form fitting shirt; all students should wear form fitting shorts, no tights.

Non-binary students are able to mix and match from the above options in order to find attire that feels comfortable and productive to work in.

DANCE ATTIRE/SHOES CAN ALSO BE FOUND IN THE CTA DANCE STORE ON THE UPPER LEVEL OF THE THEATRE SALINA LOBBY.

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

DROP-OFF AND PICKUPS: Teachers will be present 5 minutes prior to class. Please do not leave your students unsupervised before this time. Students are not to use studios without staff supervision. Students up to 8 years old must be dropped off and picked up from their classroom by a guardian. Please be prompt, as adult supervision concludes at the end of class. Students should use the north white door or door marked "Stage Door 1" on the west side of the building to enter for classes. Students should wait for rides indoors for their health and safety at all times. We ask parents to please be aware during pickup times that students may be crossing through the parking lot.

SCHEDULE: CTA follows the USD305 schedule for weather and holiday closures. These cancellations will be communicated via email by the Education Director and/or teachers. Individual class cancellations will be announced by the teachers and a makeup class will be scheduled to the best of our abilities.

DRESS CODE & CLASS CONDUCT: Each class has a specific dress code that is outlined in our brochure. Gum, candy, toys, food, smoking or beverages other than water are not allowed in our studios. Cell phones are to be used for classroom purposes only, such as videoing choreography or voice recording vocal parts. Students are responsible for bringing class necessities such as dance shoes, water bottles, pencils or other additional needs as specified by teachers. Lockers are available for rent for \$5/semester outside of the Rehearsal Room or Studio 2. Students may bring locks from home to secure their belongings in their rented locker for the duration of the semester if needed. At CTA, we understand that words have weight and will speak with kindness and honesty. Theatre Salina and Center for Theatre Arts have a no-tolerance policy when it comes to bigotry, body shaming or harmful language of any kind. CTA students are representatives of CTA and their conduct reflects on our organization. All students' presence has value in the space, just as much as the person next to them. No one student has more value than the other, regardless of age, experience, title, role, company status, or class load.

CLASS & SESSION CANCELLATION: Class registration minimum is 4 students, unless otherwise indicated. Class sessions may be canceled due to low registration. In that event, a refund will be distributed and alternate classes will be suggested for students. In the event that a date of class must be canceled due to teacher conflicts, a makeup date will be offered as the schedule permits.

ABSENCES & CLASS WITHDRAWAL: If your child will not be able to attend his or her scheduled class, please contact the class teacher in advance. No tuition adjustments are made for missed lessons. Should a student need to withdraw from class, please notify the Education Director or Business Manager. Billing will continue until notice has been given directly.

TUITION: Tuition is posted on the 1st of each month. There will be no refunds after the first scheduled class, whether or not the student attended those classes. Tuition will not be refunded mid-month for a drop. We offer a variety of payment methods including ACH, check, and credit card. Once your child is registered, you are responsible for making payments regardless of student attendance. Participation in CenterStage at the end of the season is only guaranteed for students in good financial standing. Overdue accounts will not be able to participate. Triple Threat Camp students that drop out of camp within one month will be charged 30% of camp tuition. TTC students that drop camp the week before and/or first day for non-emergency reasons will be charged 50% camp tuition.

MEDICAL: In the event of a medical emergency, if we are unable to contact a guardian/emergency contact, or if time does not permit, we will take the student to Salina Regional Health Center or use the 911 service. Expenses incurred will be paid by the guardian or student.

VISITORS: Visitors are not allowed in the classroom. All children present in classes must be registered. Teachers are not responsible for unregistered CTA students. Parent observation days may be scheduled throughout the year by the teacher if they occur.

STUDENT/TEACHER INTERACTION: Some classes may need instructors to make hands-on contact to adjust alignment or demonstration proper motion, particularly in dance. Teachers will ask for consent before proceeding. Teachers and students are expected to respect everyone's physical space and boundaries. Students have the right to change their minds as to what they are comfortable with and can make their boundaries known.

REMOVAL FROM CLASS: Should a student be disruptive or disrespectful, they may be asked to exit the class. Should the behaviors continue, a meeting will be set up with parents, the student and Education Director to create a progressive plan of action. If the behaviors still continue, the student will not be welcomed back to class.

SICKNESS/ILLNESS: Students (and teachers) who fall ill cannot come to class if they have a fever of any kind. They may return to class after being fever free after 24 hours (without the assistance of medicine). If you(r student) is experiencing covid, flu or RSV symptoms, we ask that they be kept home for monitoring/testing and for their own recovery.



CenterStage gives our students the opportunity to showcase what they have learned throughout the year and is a fun and exciting way to cap off the year. All classes, unless indicated, are structured to work toward performing at CenterStage.

Ticketing information will be emailed by the Education Director. If a student misses four or more classes during the 2nd semester, the CTA Education Director and teachers reserve the right to withdraw that student from performing in CenterStage. CenterStage is a privilege.

Every student owes it to their class and themselves to be in attendance each week.

Costumes for the showcase will be chosen by the teacher and announced to students and parents by the end of March. Costumes range in price from \$10 - \$100 and must be paid in full when ordering - no later than the first week of April. Costume deposits are applied toward this amount and are non-refundable. Students must have a costume to perform.


